An opportunity for an Endowed Chair may be available for the successful candidate.

The preferred candidates will be academic physicians in the fields of either general, behavior developmental or community pediatrics. Candidates with demonstrated strong clinical skills, a record of scholarly activity and interest in medical student/resident/fellow education and teaching are preferred.

The appropriate series and appointment at the Associate or Full Professor level will be based on the candidate's qualifications and experience.
