

## Administrator, Research

The Department of Pediatrics at the University of Washington has an outstanding opportunity for an Administrator, Research (Payroll Title, Administrator-Program Operations) located in Seattle, WA. The position serves as the primary resource for department faculty and staff on grant and contract compliance, policies and procedures. The role requires extensive knowledge of regulations and procedures of various funding agencies, including but not limited to NIH, other government entities (i.e. CDC, Department of Defense), foundations, and the University of Washington.

As the second largest Department in the UW School of Medicine, Pediatrics has approximately 1,500 appointments, including approximately 525+ paid faculty members, 150 paid staff employees, 125 residents, 100 fellows and 650 volunteer/affiliate faculty and continues to grow each year.
