Opened in 1901 in a converted house on Castellar Street (in what is now Chinatown)

- 14 patients cared for in first year
- Surgery suite in converted pantry
- Moved to current location in 1914
- In 1901, city leaders envisioned a place of hope, compassion and healing for all children, regardless of their families' financial status. A two-story house was turned into a hospital and a sign was placed on the balcony that read "Children's Hospital."








Total Outpatient Volume


