





Lessons Learned

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- Piloting technology without proper clinical leadership engagement and adoption often dooms projects.
- Important to start with the key problems, not the technology
- Building strong metrics upfront is key towards ensuring value is achieved
- New technologies must work well with existing workflows
- Securing budget for novel, risky innovative projects is difficult when competing for budget against other priorities.
- Focus on 1 innovative project at a time



- ► Helping to create new clinical, research, and business partnerships







